TERMS OF REFERENCE

SUPPLY, DELIVERY AND INSTALLATION OF GLASS DOORS AND WINDOWS ENCLOSURE FOR WELLNESS CENTER

I. BACKGROUND

The Commission on Human Rights (Commission) is an independent National Human Rights Institution (NHRI) created under the 1987 Philippine Constitution, established on 05 May 1987 by virtue of Executive Order N o. 163. The Commission is mandated to conduct investigations on human rights violations against marginalized and vulnerable sectors of the society, involving civil and political rights.

The Commission is currently managing to improve and renovate its existing facilities by providing an adequate and more conducive working environment for CHR employees, clients, and visitors. Inclusive of this, is the installation of glass doors and windows enclosure for Wellness Center.

II. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this project is to obtain the services of a qualified and competent contractor who is capable to provide required specifications of glass doors and windows enclosure for Wellness Center as set below in the Scope of Work and Technical Specification/Bill of Quantities.

III. DESCRIPTION AND SCOPE OF SERVICES

The services shall include the following activities:

- 1. Site inspection and verification of dimensions on actual.
- 2. Check and verify the drawings/design provided by the CHR Consultant before any installation to be done.
- 3. Installation of frames of doors and exterior glazing.
- 4. Installation of glass for the doors and exterior glazing.
- 5. Punch listing.

IV. TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION AND BILL OF QUANTITIES

V. PROJECT DURATION

Supply, delivery and installation must be completed within thirty (30) calendar days upon receipt of Notice to Proceed (NTP) and execution of Contract. Any delay beyond the stipulated period shall be subject to penalty charges specified in the succeeding provisions.

VI. REQUIREMENTS

A. QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

The Bidder must have the necessary experience and expertise in the above-mentioned project or similar project by submitting proofs of the following as part of the technical proposal:

- 1. Business Permit/Licenses of the Bidder;
- 2. Engaged in the same business for at least two (2) years;
- 3. No record of at least 3 months overdue project delivery at the CHR (those without request for extension);
- 4. Bidder's office should be located within Mega Manila.

B. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Interested suppliers are required to submit their valid and current Mayor's permit, and PhilGeps Registration Number, upon submission of Quotation/Proposal. PhilGeps Membership may be submitted in lieu of the Mayor's/ Business Permit and the PhilGeps Registration Number.

C. FINANCIAL OFFER

1. The prospective supplier must quote the best offer of the subject item. The financial offer shall be tax inclusive and shall be used as basis for the evaluation and calculation of the quotation.

VII. TERMS AND CONDITION

A. The Purchase Order (P.O.) and Contract shall be accepted by the supplier prior to the delivery of goods/services.

- B. Non-availability of goods in bill of quantities shall be made known to the Procuring Entity/End-User prior to the implementation of the project.
- C. The Commission shall have the right to reject the goods and/or cancel the P.O./Contract and request for improvements/replacement if they are found to be non-compliant with the specifications. Further, the Commission shall have the right to inspect and/or test the goods to confirm if the latter are in conformity with the technical specifications.
- D. Supplier may submit a request for extension of delivery within the period specified in the contract for the approval of the Head of Procuring Entity (HoPE).
- E. Failure to deliver goods as specified in the contract or within the extension period shall authorize the Commission to liquidated damages of at least equal to one-tenth of one percent (0.0001) of the cost of unperformed portion for everyday of delay. The Commission may rescind the contract once the cumulative amount of liquidated damages reaches ten percent (10%) of the amount of the contract, without prejudice to other courses of action and remedies available under the circumstances.
- F. Any interlineations, erasures or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initialed by the bidder or his/her duly authorized representative.
- G. Any modifications in the contract implementation must be approved by the Commission.
- H. No subcontracting shall be allowed for the entire project.

VIII. TERMS OF PAYMENT

- 1. Fifteen percent (15%) Mobilization Fund
- 2. Eighty-five percent (85%) upon approval of the Final Acceptance Report by the end-user.

Note: A. Retention Fund shall be deducted every billing.

B. Retention Fund shall be released to the Contractor after three (3) months from date of Final Completion and Acceptance.

Payment shall be made through Land Bank's LDDAP-ADA/BANK Transfer facility, processed within fifteen (15) calendar days upon final acceptance of goods as described in the Scope of Work, Technical Specifications and Bill of Quantities and upon approval in the Inspection and Acceptance Report (IAR) and Certificate of Completion. Bank Transfer fee shall be charged against the creditor's account for other Banking Institution.

IX. APPROVED BUDGET FOR THE CONTRACT (ABC):

Two Hundred Thousand Pesos Only - ₱ 200,000.00

X. WARRANTY AND COVERAGE

Warranty – At least three (3) months warranty on labor and materials from the date of the Final Acceptance of the project.

X. EXECUTION AND PRE-TERMINATION OF THE CONTRACT

- 1. This Terms of Reference (TOR) shall form an integral part of the Contract, which shall be executed by and between the Commission as the Procuring Entity and the Supplier upon issuance of the Notice of Award (NOA).
- 2. The Contract and this TOR shall be implemented in accordance with the terms and conditions herein stipulated. Failure on the part of the Supplier to comply with any of the provisions of the Contract and this TOR shall warrant its pre-termination. The Commission shall inform the Supplier within ten (10) calendar days prior to the effectivity of the termination.
- 3. In case of pre-termination, the Supplier shall be liable to pay an additional liquidated damages equivalent to five percent (5%) of the Contract Price, in accordance with the Government Accounting Manual, and the performance security shall be forfeited. The Supplier shall further be blacklisted or disqualified from participating in any other project.

XI. MODE OF PROCUREMENT

The mode of procurement shall be through Alternative Mode or whatever is applicable, based on the Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act 9184 specifically known as "An Act Providing for the Modernization, Standardization and Regulation of the Procurement Activities of the Government and for other Purposes".
