REQUEST FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FOR PROCUREMENT OF CONSULTING SERVICES FOR THE SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT OF TREATY OBLIGATIONS AND UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW MONITORING SYSTEM (TOUPRMS)

 The Commission on Human Rights (CHR), through the National Expenditure Program (NEP) FY 2025 intends to apply the sum of Five Million Pesos (PhP5,000,000) being the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) to payments under the contract of the services to do the Software Development of Treaty Obligations and Universal Periodic Review Monitoring System (TOUPRMS);

Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at the opening of the financial proposals.

2. The CHR now calls for the submission of eligibility documents for the shortlisting of bidders for Software Development of Treaty Obligations and Universal Periodic Review Monitoring System (TOUPRMS);

Expression of Interest and Eligibility documents of interested consultants must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat on or before 10:00AM of December 4, 2024 at the Commission on Human Rights, 3rdFloor, SAAC Building, U.P. Complex, Commonwealth Avenue, Diliman, Quezon City. Applications for eligibility will be evaluated based on a non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion.

3. Interested bidders may obtain further information from the CHR Procurement Division or BAC Secretariat at the address given below from 9:00AM to 4:00PM, Monday to Friday only, excluding holidays, starting November 27, 2024.

5. The BAC shall draw up the short list of consultants from those who have submitted Expression of Interest, including the eligibility documents, and have been determined as eligible in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act 9184 (RA 9184), otherwise known as the "Government Procurement Reform Act", and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). The short list shall consist of at least one (1) prospective bidder who will be entitled to submit bids. The criteria and rating system for short listing are:

6. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion as specified in the IRR of RA 9184.

Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, cooperatives, and partnerships or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines.

7. The CHR shall evaluate bids using the *Quality-Cost Based Evaluation/Selection* (QCBE/QCBS). using the following rating for the corresponding proposal:

Technical Proposal = 80% Financial Proposal = 20%

The detailed criteria and rating system for the evaluation of bids shall be provided in the Instructions to Bidders.

8. The contract shall be completed within the period of six (6) months from the issuance and actual receipt by the Consultant of the Notice to Proceed (NTP).



- 9. The CHR reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Section 41 of RA 9184 and its IRR, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

Section II. Eligibility Documents

Notes on the Eligibility Documents

This Section provides the information necessary for prospective bidders to prepare responsive Eligibility Documents in accordance with the requirement of the Procuring Entity.

The provisions contained in this Section are to be used unchanged. Additional information or requirements specific to each procurement shall be specified in the EDS.

1. Eligibility Criteria

- 1.1 The following persons/entities shall be allowed to participate in the bidding for Consulting Services:
 - (a) Duly licensed Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships;
 - (b) Partnerships duly organized under the laws of the Philippines and of which at least sixty percent (60%) of the interest belongs to citizens of the Philippines;
 - (c) Corporations duly organized under the laws of the Philippines and of which at least sixty percent (60%) of the outstanding capital stock belongs to citizens of the Philippines;
 - (d) Cooperatives duly organized under the laws of the Philippines; or
 - (e) Persons/entities forming themselves into a joint venture, *i.e.*, a group of two (2) or more persons/entities that intend to be jointly and severally responsible or liable for a particular contract: Provided, however, That Filipino ownership or interest thereof shall be at least sixty percent (60%). For this purpose, Filipino ownership or interest shall be based on the contributions of each of the members of the joint venture as specified in their JVA.

- 1.2 When the types and fields of Consulting Services involve the practice of professions regulated by law, those who will actually perform the services shall be Filipino citizens and registered professionals authorized by the appropriate regulatory body to practice those professions and allied professions specified in the EDS.
- 1.3 If the Request for Expression of Interest allows participation of foreign consultants, prospective foreign bidders may be eligible subject to the conditions stated in the **EDS**.
- 1.4 Government owned or -controlled corporations (GOCCs) may be eligible to participate only if they can establish that they (a) are legally and financially autonomous, (b) operate under commercial law, and (c) are not attached agencies of the Procuring Entity.

2. Eligibility Requirements

- 2.1. The following eligibility requirements, together with the Eligibility Documents Submission Form, shall be submitted on or before the date of the eligibility check specified in the **Request for Expression of Interest** and Clause 5 for purposes of determining eligibility of prospective bidders:
 - (a) Class "A" Documents -

Legal Documents

(i) PhilGEPS Certificate of Registration and Membership in accordance with Section 8.5.2 of the IRR, except for foreign bidders participating in the procurement by a Philippine Foreign Service Office or Post, which shall submit their eligibility documents under Section 24.1 of the IRR, provided, that the winning Consultant shall register with PhilGEPS in accordance with Section 37.1.4 of the IRR;

Technical Documents

- (ii) Statement of the prospective bidder of all its ongoing and completed government and private contracts, including contracts awarded but not yet started, if any, whether similar or not similar in nature and complexity to the contract to be bid, within the relevant period provided in the **EDS**. The statement shall include, for each contract, the following:
 - (ii.1) the name and location of the contract;
 - (ii.2) date of award of the contract;
 - (ii.3) type and brief description of consulting services;



- (ii.4) consultant's role (whether main consultant, sub consultant, or partner in a JV)
- (ii.5) amount of contract;
- (ii.6) contract duration; and
- (ii.7) certificate of satisfactory completion or equivalent document specified in the **EDS** issued by the client, in the case of a completed contract;
- (iii) Statement of the consultant specifying its nationality and confirming that those who will actually perform the service are registered professionals authorized by the appropriate regulatory body to practice those professions and allied professions in accordance with Clause 1.2, including their respective curriculum vitae.
- (b) Class "B" Document -

If applicable, the Joint Venture Agreement (JVA) in case the joint venture is already in existence, or duly notarized statements from all the potential joint venture partners in accordance with Section 24.1(b) of the IRR of RA 9184.

- 2.2. The eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents to be submitted to the BAC must be in English. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents submitted to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation of the documents in English. The documents shall be translated by the relevant foreign government agency, the foreign government agency authorized to translate documents, or a registered translator in the foreign bidder's country; and shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment/post or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.
- 2.3. Prospective bidders may obtain a full range of expertise by associating with individual consultant(s) and/or other consultants or entities through a JV or subcontracting arrangements, as appropriate. However, sub consultants may only participate in the bid of one short listed consultant. Foreign Consultants shall seek the participation of Filipino Consultants by entering into a JV with, or subcontracting part of the project to, Filipino Consultants.

3. Format and Signing of Eligibility Documents

3.1. Prospective bidders shall submit their eligibility documents through their duly authorized representative on or before the deadline specified in Clause 5.



- 3.2. Prospective bidders shall prepare an original and two (2) copies of the eligibility documents. In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.
- 3.3. The Eligibility Documents Submission Form shall be signed by the duly authorized representative/s of the Bidder. Failure to do so shall be a ground for the rejection of the eligibility documents.
- 3.4. Any interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initialed by the duly authorized representative/s of the prospective bidder.

4. Sealing and Marking of Eligibility Documents

- 4.1. Prospective bidders shall enclose their original eligibility documents described in Clause 2.1, in a sealed envelope marked "ORIGINAL ELIGIBILITY DOCUMENTS". Each copy thereof shall be similarly sealed duly marking the envelopes as "COPY NO. ___ ELIGIBILITY DOCUMENTS". These envelopes containing the original and the two (2) copies shall then be enclosed in one single envelope.
- 4.2. The original and the number of copies of the eligibility documents as indicated in the **EDS** shall be typed or written in ink and shall be signed by the prospective bidder or its duly authorized representative/s.
- 4.3. All envelopes shall:
 - (c) contain the name of the contract to be bid in capital letters;
 - (d) bear the name and address of the prospective bidder in capital letters;
 - (e) be addressed to the Procuring Entity's BAC specified in the **EDS**;
 - (f) bear the specific identification of this Project indicated in the EDS; and
 - (g) bear a warning "DO NOT OPEN BEFORE..." the date and time for the opening of eligibility documents, in accordance with Clause 5.
- 4.4 Eligibility documents that are not properly sealed and marked, as required in the bidding documents, shall not be rejected, but the bidder or its duly authorized representative shall acknowledge such condition of the documents as submitted. The BAC shall assume no responsibility for the misplacement of the contents of the improperly sealed or marked eligibility documents, or for its premature opening.

5. Deadline for Submission of Eligibility Documents



Eligibility documents must be received by the Procuring Entity's BAC at the above mention address and on or before the date and time indicated in the Request for Expression of Interest and the **EDS**.

6. Late Submission of Eligibility Documents

Any eligibility documents submitted after the deadline for submission and receipt prescribed in Clause 0 and shall not be accepted by the Procuring Entity. The BAC shall record in the minutes the submission and opening of eligibility documents, the Bidder's name, its representative and the time the eligibility documents were submitted late.

7. Modification and Withdrawal of Eligibility Documents

- 7.1. The prospective bidder may modify its eligibility documents after it has been submitted; provided that the modification is received by the Procuring Entity prior to the deadline specified in Clause 5. The prospective bidder shall not be allowed to retrieve its original eligibility documents, but shall be allowed to submit another set equally sealed, properly identified, linked to its original bid marked as "ELIGIBILITY MODIFICATION" and stamped "received" by the BAC. Modifications received after the applicable deadline shall not be considered and shall be returned to the prospective bidder unopened.
- 7.2. A prospective bidder may, through a letter of withdrawal, withdraw its eligibility documents after it has been submitted, for valid and justifiable reason; provided that the letter of withdrawal is received by the Procuring Entity prior to the deadline prescribed for submission and receipt of eligibility documents.
- 7.3. Eligibility documents requested to be withdrawn in accordance with this Clause shall be returned unopened to the prospective bidder concerned. A prospective bidder that withdraws its eligibility documents shall not be permitted to submit another set, directly or indirectly, for the same project. A prospective bidder that acquired the eligibility documents may also express its intention not to participate in the bidding through a letter which should reach and be stamped by the BAC before the deadline for submission and receipt of eligibility documents.

8. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Eligibility Documents

8.1. The BAC will open the envelopes containing the eligibility documents in the presence of the prospective bidders' representatives who choose to attend, at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in the **EDS**. The prospective bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance.

In case the submitted eligibility envelopes cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the BAC shall take custody of the said envelopes and

reschedule the opening on the next working day or at the soonest possible time through the issuance of a Notice of Postponement to be posted in the PhilGEPS website and the website of the Procuring Entity concerned.

- 8.2. Letters of withdrawal shall be read out and recorded during the opening of eligibility documents and the envelope containing the corresponding withdrawn eligibility documents shall be returned unopened to the withdrawing prospective bidder.
- 8.3. The eligibility documents envelopes and modifications, if any, shall be opened one at a time, and the following read out and recorded:
 - (h) the name of the prospective bidder;
 - (i) whether there is a modification or substitution; and
 - (j) the presence or absence of each document comprising the eligibility documents vis-à-vis a checklist of the required documents.
- The eligibility of each prospective bidder shall be determined by examining 8.4. each bidder's eligibility requirements or statements against a checklist of requirements, using non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion, as stated in the Request for Expression of Interest, and shall be determined as either "eligible" or "ineligible." If a prospective bidder submits the specific eligibility document required, he shall be rated "passed" for that particular requirement. In this regard, failure to submit a requirement, or an incomplete or patently insufficient submission, shall be considered "failed" for the particular eligibility requirement concerned. If a prospective bidder is rated "passed" for all the eligibility requirements, he shall be considered eligible to participate in the bidding, and the BAC shall mark the set of eligibility documents of the prospective bidder concerned as "eligible." If a prospective bidder is rated "failed" in any of the eligibility requirements, he shall be considered ineligible to participate in the bidding, and the BAC shall mark the set of eligibility documents of the prospective bidder concerned as "ineligible." In either case, the BAC chairperson or his duly designated authority shall countersign the markings.

9. Short Listing of Consultants

- 9.1. Only prospective bidders whose submitted contracts are similar in nature and complexity to the contract to be bid as provided in the **EDS** shall be considered for short listing.
- 9.2. The BAC shall draw up the short list of prospective bidders from those declared eligible using the detailed set of criteria and rating system to be used specified in the **EDS**.
- 9.3. Short listed consultants shall be invited to participate in the bidding for this project through a Notice of Eligibility and Short Listing issued by the BAC.

10. Protest Mechanism

Decision of the Procuring Entity at any stage of the procurement process may be questioned in accordance with Section 55 of the IRR of RA 9184.

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

I. BACKGROUND

The CHR is in need of an enhanced, consolidated online monitoring system that will meet the following objectives:

- Hold the government to account for their human rights obligations through transparency. An online monitoring system that is readily available and accessible on the internet can make duty bearers (State actors), rightsholders (the people) and stakeholders (NHRIs, civil society, international organizations, and other non-state actors) more aware of existing government actions in the implementation of treaty body concluding observations and UPR recommendations;
- 2. Provide a consolidated, systematic knowledge portal specific to the Philippines' compliance with international treaty obligations on human rights that can assist in policy advisory and research and inform lawmakers, government officials, researchers, students, the academe and relevant stakeholders who contribute to policy advocacy and development; and
- 3. Invite participation of all relevant stakeholders (such as civil society and international organizations) in contributing inputs to the monitoring monitoring system. Since the monitoring system is online, it offers a participatory approach where people can contact the CHR and report on the State's compliance with specific human rights treaties. Additionally, they can also suggest the improvement of the site should they encounter challenges in navigating it.

The CHR draws inspiration from these databases of other national human rights institutions, United Nations agencies, and non-governmental organizations:



- The Danish Institute for Human Rights has developed a comprehensive database merging the SDGs with international human rights treaties and declarations. The database is a general online reference that can be further adapted by States for local monitoring of their own SDGs implementation https://sdgdata.humanrights.dk/en/solr-explorer
- Uganda's Human Rights Commission too developed a database containing UPR recommendations. As a good practice for databases, it enshrines recommendations from the UPR, Special Procedures, treaty bodies and regional mechanisms: http://www.uhrcdatabase.ug/
- 3. The OHCHR has established the Universal Human Rights Index (UHRI), which is designed to facilitate access to human rights recommendations issued by three key pillars of the UN human rights protection system: the Treaty Bodies established under the international human rights treaties as well as the Special Procedures and the UPR of the Human Rights Council. The UHRI aims at assisting States in the implementation of these recommendations and at facilitating the work of national stakeholders such as NHRIs, NGOs, civil society and academics as well as the UN.1 The UHRI is accessible in this link: http://uhri.ohchr.org/en/
- 4. UPR Info's database is heavily relied on by the CHR, and the latter has been participating in its pre-sessions that provide a platform not only for NHRIs but also for civil society to engage with Member States in raising possible recommendations to States under Review such as the Philippines. "UPR Info's Database of UPR recommendations and voluntary pledges allows relevant stakeholders to access and search all UPR recommendations and voluntary pledges across several categories: State under Review, Recommending State, Regional Group, Organisation, Response UPR cycle, Thematic Issues, and Type of Action. Some of them are exclusive to this database developed by UPR Info." https://upr-infounique database.uwazi.io/
- 5. The Rights Tracker of the Human Rights Measurement Initiative (HRMI) is the first global project to track the human rights performance of countries systematically. HRMI's goal is "to measure country performance of every human right in international law. The tracker began with a collection of civil and political rights (Empowerment and Safety from the State rights), and a collection of economic and social rights (Quality of Life rights), each measured by a different method." https://rightstracker.org/

6. Monitoring of the implementation and commitments to the resolutions of the UN Human Rights Council and Third Committee of the UN General Assembly by the Philippine government is also a crucial initiative of the CHR, specifically the implementation of HRC Resolution 45/33 entitled Technical cooperation and capacity-building for the promotion and protection of human rights in the Philippines adopted by the Human Rights Council on 7 October 2020, as well as General Assembly resolutions on the moratorium on the death penalty. The databases of the Human Rights Information and Documentation System (HURIDOCS) and the Universal Rights Group (URG) are relied on by the CHR: https://www.right-docs.org/ and https://www.universal-rights.org/human-rights/human-rights-resolutions-portal/

The existing databases, spreadsheets and websites of the CHR can replicate the aforementioned systems of the NHRIs, UHRI and databases of aforementioned international NGOs. The enhanced monitoring system(s) of the CHR are made specific to the human rights context in the Philippines and its international obligations, as well as the needs of the CHR in implementing a more robust and efficient treaty compliance monitoring.

The enhanced monitoring system of the CHR aspires to merge the recommendations and concluding observations of international human rights mechanisms (i.e., treaty bodies; Universal Periodic Review; Human Rights Council/Third Committee/General Assembly Resolutions relevant to human rights; Special Procedures; International Labor Organization Conventions; and the Sustainable Development Goals) and match them with existing government actions. The enhanced system will make cross-references and concrete links between the implementation of the nine (9) core international human rights treaties and the other international mechanisms mentioned above.

II. OBJECTIVES

This project is being proposed to address the need of the CHR for an enhanced online monitoring system to assess the State's compliance with international human rights obligations and commitments by enhancing the existing CHR Human Rights Observatory, available at this link https://chr-observatories.uwazi.io/. Specifically, this project will:

- Consolidate all existing CHR monitoring systems and tools (i.e., Human Rights Observatories, Right to Life Microsite (https://righttolifeph.online), and the Excel Spreadsheets) into one;
- 2. Expand the coverage of the monitoring system to include obligations and commitments from:





- a. Obligations under the core human rights treaties and optional protocols ratified by the Philippines, as well as observations and recommendations in Treaty Body concluding observations;
- b. Obligations under the ILO Conventions ratified by the Philippines;
- c. Commitments under the Universal Periodic Review;
- d. Recommendations in country visit reports by Special Procedures mandate-holders;
- e. Generic recommendations to all UN Member States in Human Rights Council/ General Assembly Resolutions that are relevant to human rights in the Philippines and Filipinos abroad; and
- f. Commitments under the Sustainable Development Goals;

3. Improve the functionality of the monitoring system to include a way to:

- a. Match obligations and commitments with existing or ongoing actions/initiatives by the government as documented in CHR reports and external sources;
- b. Cross-reference and make concrete links among the seven sources of obligations and commitments, as well as all reference documents;
- Categorize information based on mechanism, human rights themes, concerned persons/groups/sectors, and SDGs;
- d. Visualize information and analysis based on human rights indicators using the SPO indicators of the OHCHR;
- e. Add, edit, and publish information in real-time;

The ten percent (10%) Retention Money shall be proportionately deducted from each progress payment as a reserve fund for system bugs/errors that may occur within the warranty period. The System Developer Company may, however, request the release of the Retention Money subject to submission of the following:
